HOW TO BE READY TO LEARN:

- This week (week 8) you will be given the opportunity to reorganise yourselves by ensuring you have the equipment you need to learn at Emerald State High School. You need to check that you have the following:
- In your pencil case you should have: 2-3 working pens, a pencil, eraser, sharpener, ruler, calculator, glue, scissors highlighter, whiteboard marker for show me boards and any specialist items that you need for a subject (ask your teachers if unsure). - Your work should be in order, and neat and tidy.
