POLITE – ASK FOR PERMISSION TO LEAVE THE CLASSROOM

- LI: Students will understand how, when and for what reason they may ask to leave a classroom.
- SC: Recall when they can leave the class and politely request permission from their teacher when appropriate.

POLITE – ASK FOR PERMISSION TO LEAVE THE CLASSROOM

- If you need to leave the classroom you will:
 - Raise your hand and wait quietly
 - Request permission using manners (may I please)
 - Clearly state reason-
-
- This is about your learning and your safety

POLITE – ASK FOR PERMISSION TO LEAVE THE CLASSROOM

How do you know you're doing it?

- Put our hand up.
- Wait quietly.
- Use polite language.
- Only leave the room when the teacher has given permission.
- Make sure you have the teachers out of class pass before you leave.

POLITE – ASK FOR PERMISSION TO LEAVE THE CLASSROOM

- If you leave class to go to the toilet your teacher can request that you make up that time as it is important learning time lost.
- Going to get a drink is not a valid reason to leave the class.
- With hot weather on the way- ensure you are bringing a drink bottle to class.
- You should not be asking to leave class in the first 20 minutes or the last 20 minutes of class.
- Student departure and return will be recorded on id web to ensure students are accountable while they are out of class.

POLITE – ASK FOR PERMISSION TO LEAVE THE CLASSROOM

- Real life implications
- Failure to get permission to leave the workplace can result in:
 - Loss of job (warning)
 - Injury (self and others)
 - Consumption (wasting) of time and money
 - If you are the sole person on duty and need to leave to use the toilet, closing the shop can result in loss of business for the company you work for.

BE PREPARED

- Go to the toilet before you go to class.
- Fill your water bottle up before you go to class.
- Have a drink before you go to class.
- Being out of class adds up and you lose valuable learning time.
- If you are out of class 3 minutes a lesson that equates to 12 minutes a day. Multiply that by 5 days equates to 50 minutes a week. Multiply that by 40 school weeks in a year and it adds up to be a considerable amount of learning time lost.

REVIEW

- Students must use polite language to leave the class.
- Students must have an out of class tag - (one students allowed out at a time).
- Students should not be asking to leave class in the first 20 minutes or the last 20 minutes of class.
- **Students that do ask to leave class will be made to make up curriculum time lost in their own time.**
- Students will be recorded on id web when they leave and return to class to track accountability.
- Your teacher will ask you what toilet block you visited and the condition of the facilities.
