MUSIC AWARDS

 Meritorious Involvement – Instrumental Music Program. Awarded to year 12 students who have been a member of the Instrumental Music Program.

Prize: Pen and Certificate.

SEP AWARDS

1. **CQ News SEP All Rounder.** Awarded to an SEP student who has participated and succeeded in academia/sports/arts/service to school.

Prize: Gift and Certificate.

2. **Mitre 10 Award SEP.** Awarded to an SEP student who best displays the values of the school and contributes to school life.

Prize: Gift donated by Mitre10

SPORTING EXCELLENCE

** Awards 1 – 4 will be presented at Sporting Awards night **

1. **Sporting Awards – Gold/Silver/Bronze.** Awarded to students who have represented the school at different levels of sport. (CH, CAP, State, National)

Gold awards:

- Represented at National Level or
- Represented Capricornia at State Titles in as least 2 sports or
- Member of a Capricornia winning team

Silver awards:

- Represented Capricornia at State Titles in 1 sport or
- Represented Central Highlands in at least 3 sports

Bronze awards:

Represented Central Highlands in at least 2 sports

Prize: Certificate.

2. **Wayne Parsons Memorial Sports All Rounder Award.** Awarded to a student who has participated in a variety of sports and a variety of levels.

Prize: Trophy and Certificate.

Spirit of Rugby. Awarded to a student who has represented the school and community at different rugby activities.

Prize: Trophy and Certificate.

4. **Spirit of Sport.** Awarded to a year 12 student who displays sportsman ship on and off the field always with 100% effort.

Prize: Trophy and Certificate.

5. **Junior/Senior Sportsperson of the Year.** Awarded to a year 10-12 student and a year 7-9 student who has achieved the most points from the following categories:

i.	Age champion	1 point
ii.	CH Representation	2 points
iii.	CAP Representation	3 points
İ۷.	State Representation	5 points
٧.	National Representation	7 points
vi.	International Representation	9 points

Prize: Trophy and Certificate.

6. **Pierre de Coubertin.** Awarded to a year 12 student (nominated earlier in the year by the HPE department) who has represented the school at a variety of sports (one must be an Olympic sport) and at a variety of levels. Prize: Certificate.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

NB These awards are based on results as at the end of term 3.

1. ACADEMIC AWARDS

In all subjects, students must pass to be initially considered as eligible (ie. At least a C in level of achievement) Awards are calculated using the overall achievement in the best 6 subject/units reported on term 3 report card for years 7 – 10 and 12. For year 11s awards are calculated using the semester 1 and term 3 report cards. A points system is used to calculate gold and silver. A = 3, B = 2, C = 1. For VET subjects students who have successfully completed 100% of competencies to date are awarded 3 point, 75% are awarded 2 points and 50% are awarded 1 point. Where students study less subjects, the table below will be used to determine awards.

SUBJECT AWARDS

NB Subject Awards are based on results as at the end of term 3.

1. SUBJECT AWARDS

Awarded to the student who has received the highest grade in each subject. For VET subjects it is awarded to the student with the most competencies awarded who the teacher believes has completed these to the highest standard.

SPECIAL AWARDS

NB Special Awards are dependent on continued sponsorship from donors. Where monies are given to students they will receive a prepaid VISA card. *Panel decision made on recipient.

1. CHRC MAYOR SERVICE AWARD - YEAR 12

Awarded to a year 12 student who has demonstrated outstanding commitment to helping the school and Emerald Community.

Prize: Donated prize and Certificate

2. THE RIGHT REVENEREND ALFRED CHIPMAN BURSARY – YEAR 10

Awarded to a year 10 indigenous student who demonstrates a strong commitment to their school studies and a willingness to try his/her hardest at all times.

Prize: \$250 held by the school to go towards school expenses and Certificate

3. ST LUKE'S ANGLICAN CHURCH BURSARY - YEAR 7

Awarded to a year 7 indigenous student displaying Christian values.

Prize: This bursary is to pay school fees and therefore held by the school and Certificate

4. STEM AWARD (ROBOTICS) - YEAR 9

Prize: Donated prize and Certificate

5. ESHS STUDENT COUNCIL BURSARY – YEAR 11 & 12

Awarded to students who have demonstrated outstanding community service as nominated by the SRC.

Prize: This bursary is to pay school fees and therefore held by the school and Certificate

6. GREEN BROS BURSARY - YEAR 12

Awarded to a Year 12 student with musical promise to further their music career.

Prize: Donated prize and Certificate

7. ROTARTY DON MORIARTY BURSARY – YEAR 12 *

Awarded to a Year 12 student continuing to tertiary studies.

Prize: Donated prize and Certificate

8. LACHLAN MILLER SCHOOL SPIRIT AWARD

Awarded to a student showing pride in their school by doing the right thing as an example to others.

Prize: Donated prize and Certificate

9. FREEMASONS OF ALEXANDRA AWARD – YEAR 12

Awarded to a year 12 student who has shown a willingness to assist others and participates in school and community activities.

Prize: Donated prize and Certificate

10. ADF LONG TAN LEADERSHIP AND TEAMWORK AWARD- YEAR 10 and 12 *

The awards recognise students who demonstrate leadership and teamwork within both the school and the broader community, and who display strong values, such as doing one's best, respect for others and "mateship" - values considered integral to both the ADF and Australian society. Students in Year 10 and 12 must write 1 page application for this award.

Prize: Year 10 \$250, Year 12 \$500 and Certificate

11. HEME GOLDEN VICE AWARD - YEAR 12

Awarded to a Year 12 student who has demonstrated outstanding skills in Engineering.

Prize: Donated prize and Certificate

12. ENSHAM TECHNOLOGY AWARD - YEAR 11 AND 12

Awarded to a Year 11 and 12 student who has the highest results in Maths and Science.

Prize: Year 11 \$250, Year 12 \$500 and Certificate

13. MRAEL VOCATIONAL EDUCATION

Awarded to a student who has excelled in vocational education.

Prize: Donated prize and Certificate

14. SCHOOL BASED APPRENTICE OF THE YEAR AND SCHOOL BASED TRAINEE OF THE YEAR Sponsored by MEGT, Busy at Work and KESTREL

Awarded to a student who has excelled in their traineeship.

Prize: Donated prize and Certificate

15. CQ UNIVERSITY EXCELLENCE AWARD - YEAR 12 *

Awarded to a Year 12 student continuing to tertiary studies.

Prize: Donated prize and Certificate

16. ROTARY CLUB OF EMERALD SUNRISE AWARD - YEAR 12 *

Awarded to a Year 12 student continuing to tertiary studies.

Prize: Donated prize and Certificate

17. CHAMBER OF COMMERCE - JOHN PYLE AWARD - YEAR 12 *

Awarded to a Year 12 student who will be continuing to tertiary studies in the areas of Business/Law/Commerce. This award is shared between ESHS and Marist College so is biannual.

Prize: Donated prize and Certificate

18. P&C CALTEX ALL-ROUNDER - YEAR 12 *

The student must be in Year 12 and display the following qualities: Academic - scholastic achievement across a range of subjects; Sport - represent the school, without necessarily being a champion; Leadership - role model to other students; Attitude - willingness to assist others, make selfless contributions, committed to excellence; Service - participates in school and community activities; outstanding conduct.

Prize: Donated prize, Caltex medallion and Caltex Certificate

19. P&C SENIOR DUX/DUX PROXIMUS- YEAR 12

Dux best overall achievement in Year 12 based on Scaled SAI score calculated in OP analyser. Dux Proximus student with the 2nd best scaled SAI score.
