# WHY DO STUDENTS NEED TO REPRESENT THE SCHOOL WITH PRIDE AND UPHOLD SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS?

- Students are still interacting with the public and they need to be conscious of their behaviour.
- Students need to act as role models for the school and present the school in a positive way.



### HOW CAN STUDENTS REPRESENT THE SCHOOL WITH PRIDE AND UPHOLD SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS?

- Students can be POLITE during the holidays when they are at the pool, movies, or other public places.
- Students can PARTICIPATE at home in family activities over the holidays and while they are at their place of employment.
- Students can be PREPARED over the holidays by helping their parents or carers prepare for holiday events and activities.
