WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO REPRESENT THE SCHOOL WITH PRIDE AND UPHOLD SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS?

- While students are on holidays they need to still uphold the school expectations of POLITE, PREPARED and PARTICIPATE.



WHY DO STUDENTS NEED TO REPRESENT THE SCHOOL WITH PRIDE AND UPHOLD SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS?

- Students are still interacting with the public and they need to be conscious of their behaviour.
- Students need to act as role models for the school and present the school in a positive way.



HOW CAN STUDENTS REPRESENT THE SCHOOL WITH PRIDE AND UPHOLD SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS?

- Students can be POLITE during the holidays when they are at the pool, movies, or other public places.
- Students can PARTICIPATE at home in family activities over the holidays and while they are at their place of employment.
- Students can be PREPARED over the holidays by helping their parents or carers prepare for holiday events and activities.
