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

Why is the focus important?

- It is important to report any inappropriate behaviour
- It is important that students look out for their friends and fellow peers
- It is important that students are interacting in a safe and polite way with their peers and staff

Bullying.. A  
definition.

- **Bullying is repeated behaviour intended to cause a power imbalance which intends to hurt another individual physically, mentally or emotionally.**

## Cyberbullying.. A DEFINITION

- Cyberbullying includes sending, posting, or sharing negative, harmful, false, or mean content about someone else.
- It can include sharing personal or private information about someone else causing embarrassment or humiliation. Some cyberbullying crosses the line into unlawful or criminal behaviour.

The information you are entering is about someone you believe is being bullied or harmed. You are making an anonymous notification however; you must be **truthful and responsible**.


