
Student Safety

ROUTINE SCENARIO

Fred brings his chocolate milk into the computer lab and sits it on the desk. His friend George didn't see it open and quickly turned around knocking the drink. It spills all over the keyboard, mouse and Fred's uniform.

What does Fred need to do to make things right?

PROCESSES SCENARIO

Who has been affected by Lily's actions?

What does Lily need to do to make things right?

Lily has started her hairdressing apprenticeship. Her boss asked her to hand in her training manual by Friday. Lily was lazy and forgot. Her boss decides that her lack of time management is not suitable for the position and decides to let her go.

PROCEDURES SCENARIO

It is middle of P3 on a Friday and Peter has gone to the toilet. He hears the fire bell sound. Peter thinks that this is another drill and decides to continue on to the toilets. He doesn't want to sit in the sun so he stays in the toilet for the evacuation.

Who has been affected by Peter's actions?

What does Peter need to do to make things right?

IMPLICATIONS OF NOT FOLLOWING ROUTINES, POLICIES AND PROCEDURES @ ESHS

Students will meet with their teacher to reflect on choices they are making.



Students will meet with their teacher and subject HoD to reflect on choices they are making.



Student, teacher and HoD will develop specific strategies to support the student engaging in curriculum tasks.



If poor student choices persist despite HoD and teacher intervention then relevant DP will intervene.
