

- Positive phone calls home




Celebrating the success of others

 - Congratulate others showing sportsmanship
 - Encourage others when they pick up litter
- What it looks like at a sports carnival
 - Encouraging others when they participate in an event
 - Congratulate those who place in event, even if it was not first.

The Ripple Effect
